This art-filled live and silent auction event will feature more than 90 original works of art in a variety of media donated by prominent Northern California artists. On the block will be pieces by William Allan, Chester Arnold, James Barsness, Robert Brady, Squeak Carnwath, Enrique Chagoya, Roy

De Forest, Hung Liu, Peter Saul, Inez Storer and William T. Wiley. This auction is an excellent opportunity to purchase original works of art at great prices while helping support the nonprofit di Rosa Preserve.

Latino Student Photographs To Be Shown

Gallery Route One in Point Reyes Station is sponsoring three exhibits of photographs by eight young Latino photographers in October. They are students of Luz Elena Castro, a Columbian photojournalist who has done several photo and teaching projects in the North Bay. The exhibits and will be shown at three different venues.

Through October 31st, in the Dance Palace Community Center, “Los Niños del

Pueblo” portrays the town’s younger generation. The Dance Palace is at the corner of 5th and B Streets.

From October 21st through November 27th, “Who Opens the Doors of the Town in the Morning?” focuses on the workers and shop owners whose labor keeps the town running. “Who Open the Doors ..?” will be exhibited at Gallery Route One, 11101 Highway One. Gallery Hours are 11 AM to 5 PM every day except Tuesday.

The third exhibit, “This Land As We See It”, will run from October 21st through

November 21st at Point Reyes Books, 11315 Highway One. “The Land As We See It” is a collection of landscapes by the students, many of whom live and work on nearby dairy ranches.

On October 30th at 3 PM, a bilingual progressive opening reception will be held. It will begin at Gallery Route One, move to Point Reyes Books at 4 PM and then to the Dance Palace at 5 PM for refreshments and a video documenting the project.
